Financial Report: Treasurer Ken Kamps reported the internal account has a balance of \$2,489, which includes Joker Draw money of some \$600 and also we received a check of \$448 from the sale of the Football Craze tickets. Gary Engelke encouraged members to purchase these tickets next year as it is a simple way for the club to raise money. Treasurer Kamps reported the Youth Account balance stands at \$18,673, reflecting our initial payment of \$1000 to the Library, which will come back to us with the sale of our raffle tickets.

A request for funding from the Platteville Thrift Shop for their expansion project has been tabled. The Board was rather 'luke warm' on this idea as it does not truly meet our mission. We will bring this back as a topic within the next three months to determine if we want to decline or make a donation as a good gesture.

Doug Martin stated all tickets have been distributed into the hands of members for selling. He requested money be returned to Ken on or before October 21.


