Program: Ron Weier was pleased to announce our three speakers today. They provided an interesting presentation on the UWP Study Abroad Program.

Jen Collins, a five year veteran of the UW Platteville School of Education, spoke about the importance of studying abroad. She has led Study Abroad groups to England, Russia and Africa. Before their trip, the undergrad students study the language and culture of the country they are going to. When abroad, students develop their self-confidence and independence skills, through the use of maps and other resources they don't use on a daily basis. When reflecting on the experience she said that the students usually conclude that "People are just People."

Lindsay Hollingsworth, also a five year veteran of the UW Platteville School of Education, talked about the Harlaxton Manor House where they stayed and studied. She described the different features of the classrooms and daily routine of the group while they were there. Lindsay talked about the various sites the students saw as well as how they developed new independence skills by touring in groups of two during their free time.

Paula Pittz, a junior in Middle Childhood/Early Adolescence Education, talked about her first visit abroad. She talked about the things she experienced including, airplane food, drinking tea, the various parts of the transit system (subway, taxi, and train), transferring money, the geography and history of the places they visited. She emphasized how important it was to be organized to get from place to place successfully. Even though English was the language spoken, the students had to learn the different terms they used like lift for elevator. The UWP students went into a Grade 6 (6th Grade in the US) classroom to learn about the education system. To prepare for meeting the college students, Grade 6 students tried to learn something about where they came from. Due to miscommunication they learned about both the states of Iowa and Wisconsin.

Cost for the 3 credit two week study abroad experience was about \$3,000/per student which included air fare, hotel, meals, and transportation. Jen and Lindsay raised \$13,000 in grants to make the cost reasonable for the students.
