Joker Draw: Last three digits, 182, belonging to Carley Borcherding, only to draw the 9 of clubs.



We met a real 'hero' this morning, Kent Scheuerell! When I first learned of who was speaking on July 13 and the topic, I was looking for an excuse not to attend. How thankful I am I could not come up with an excuse. I personally left our meeting this morning, as I'm quite sure others did as well, feeling blessed to have what I have and to look at issues, I think are substantial, to be a little less important.

I question myself as to whether I can truly do justice to the presentation made by Kent, so I've summarized in what I took away from his presentation.

Kent survives every day with support teams, Alzheimer's Alliance, Homeward Bound, Memory Café's, assistance with outside work, etc. etc. His primary focus, day in and day out, is caring for and making life happy for his wife, Carolyn,

We met Carolyn this morning, through her spouse, Kent Scheuerell. We heard about Carolyn as a loving wife, mother, sibling, her career at State National Bank, her tendency for accuracy and neatness, her complete and overall positive outlook on life! Carolyn will turn 71 in August. At the age of 62-63, during the last year before Kent's retirement, 'things' for Carolyn seemed to be somewhat out of sync. Not just 'one' thing, but a



combination of 'things'. There was an 'elephant' in the room and no one was ready to talk about the 'elephant'. The day came when they, Kent and Carolyn, had to face the fact; Carolyn was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Sad, but true, Carolyn knew at that point what lay ahead of her.

Today is a different time, Carolyn lives in the moment, enjoys music and dancing. She is cared for 24/7, still recognizes Kent and depending on the day, thinks Kent is a 'nice guy'; however, Kent is unsure if she still recognizes her children. He arranged for a 45th Wedding Anniversary Celebration as he knew at 50 Carolyn perhaps would not realize the joy associated with the event. He celebrates her birthday every year with family as a way of bringing fun and laughter into her life. Kent continues to become educated on this dreadful disease and continually looks for ways to have fun with his wife, Carolyn, of 48 years.

Kent stated, "Life chooses you". Life chose Kent and Carolyn to deal with this devastating life challenge. He was open to questions from the members and encouraged everyone dealing with individuals who have Alzheimer's, to **Give Hugs** and **Be Happy**!
